

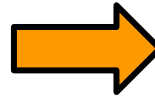
Private Pilot Course

Payment Methods

Total Cost

The cost of your Private Pilot's license depends on the time required to complete the program, as well as a variety of factors including the frequency of lessons, physical coordination, language comprehension, weather variability and instructor availability. The national average for earning a Private Pilot's license is 80+ hours. The Princeton Flying School has averaged 65 flight hours in the past. If you are able to take Lessons 2-3 times a week, and take less than 80 hours your license cost could be as low as \$15,000-\$18,000.
